We were also challenged as we left national friends in difficult situations which we could have assisted them in. We had to acknowledge that even though we were leaving, God wasn't.

At the end of May Mikah graduated high school! A proud moment for her parents. At the same time we were packing our crates to ship to Canada and also selling whatever we were not taking with us. A rather large task! Hugo had a week off work before we left and with the help of friends we were able to get it all done in between goodbye parties and graduation celebrations. We were honoured when the flight crew from MAF put on a goodbye party for us and two other families who were leaving. The party included games, speeches and yummy food.

A plethora of emotions were running through us. Sadness at leaving our work and friends behind, but also excitement for whatever the future might hold, and the opportunities for our children.

We first went to Holland to visit with Hugo's family and even got to spend half a day with almost all of Erica's aunts and uncles; very special! Then we flew to Ontario and spent nearly four weeks there doing medicals, debriefing with MAF, and visiting family, friends and supporters.

Then we embarked on our second drive across Canada. This time we broke down in Saskatchewan, where our friends' parents rescued us and hosted us until our van was repaired. We are very grateful for their care!

We arrived in Aldergrove, BC the first week of August.
Since then we have cleaned up and sold our home and purchased another one that will fit our family better as children tend to grow a lot over a period of ten years! We moved the beginning of October.

Currently Hugo is taking online courses and actively looking for a job in the aviation industry. Erica is embarking on a new career as a Care Aide and will hopefully

go back to school next September. Mikah is living at Trinity Western University, studying English and thoroughly enjoying herself. Christiaan and Aidan are at Credo High School and Marc and Brynne are at Credo Elementary.

We are grateful for the new friends they've already made and for the assistance both schools have provided as the kids get settled into their new lives. We are also thankful to our home church in Aldergrove for their warm welcome to our family.
